SECTION 4: First-aid Measures

Description of necessary measures:

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air. Drink water to clear throat and blow nose to evacuate dust. Seek medical attention if difficulty breathing.

Skin contact: Wash hands and skin with soap and water.

Eye contact: Do not rub eyes. Flush eyes with large quantities of water. If irritation persists consult a physician.

Ingestion: Do not induce vomiting. Rinse mouth with water. Dilute by giving 1-2 glasses of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

Most important symptoms/effects, acute and delayed: Prolonged & repeated exposure to excessive concentrations of this product's dust or any nuisance dust can cause chronic pulmonary disease. Dust contact with eyes may cause temporary scratching or redness. This product is NOT classified as a carcinogen by NTP or IARC.

This product may contain crystalline silica at below detectable levels (<0.1%) CAS No. 14808-60-7 as it is derived from natural minerals.

Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment needed: There is no specific antidote and treatment should be directed at the control of symptoms and the clinical condition.

SECTION 5: Fire-fighting measures
